Dear Parents and Carers,

Following its ongoing success where we have raised in excess of £2500 to purchase new reading books for school, we are running another **Readathon** as part of our Reading Week, and are encouraging as many children as possible to take part. As so many of our annual fundraisers have had to be cancelled, due to Covid-19, this will be an excellent opportunity to raise extra funds for school and additional resources for the children

The Readathon will help motivate reluctant readers to give reading a go, and keen readers to read more widely. It works because children choose what they want to read - they are not being assessed and it is very much concerned with reading for fun. We would like you to support your child by encouraging them to take part, sponsoring them if possible, and by encouraging friends and family members to also sponsor them. Any money raised will be used to buy more new books for school!

How the Readathon will work...

- A Readathon sponsorship form has been uploaded to the website and paper copies will follow when the children return to school; please encourage them to find as many sponsors as possible. (We suggest approximately 50p per 10 pages.)
- During reading week, children will be given free time in class to read, (identified by the Readathon bell ringing), and the number of pages each child reads will be supervised by class teachers. Children are free to bring in their own book(s) or borrow one from school.
- At the end of the week, the total number of pages read will be calculated, and children will then collect their sponsorship money from friends and family, and bring it into school.
- All sponsorship money will be spent on new books for school!
